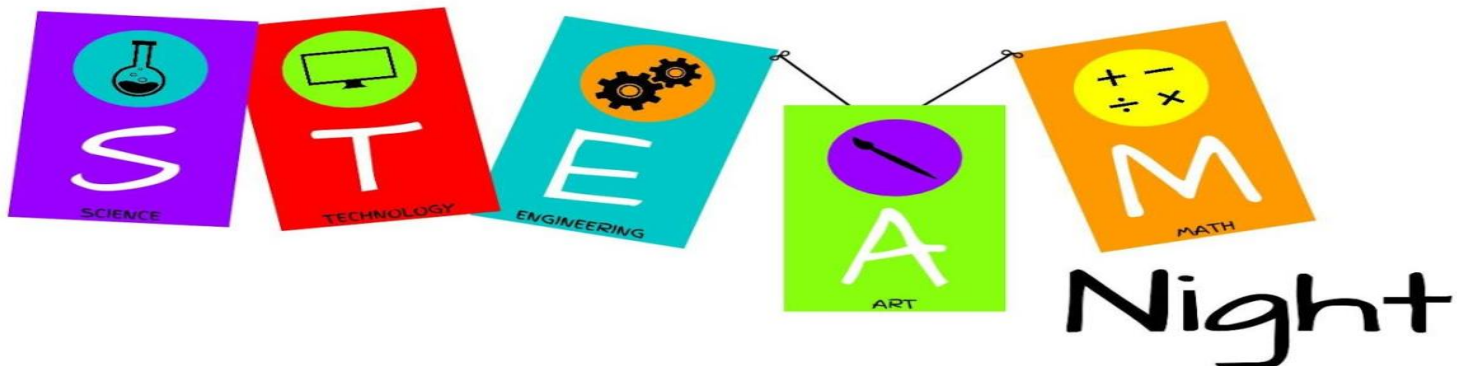


News from the OPE Clinic

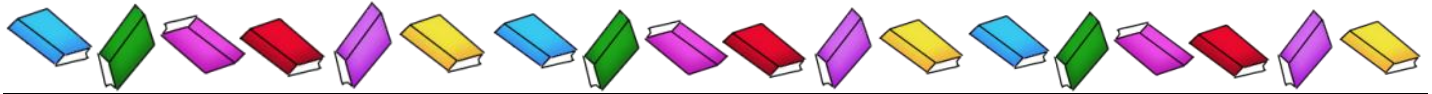
It all started with an idea and a little creativity for District Volunteer of the Year, Parent, PTO's CAAP (Children's Access to Art Program)

Chair at Ocean Palms Elementary, who wanted to expand this school art program by ensuring it reached every corner and classroom of Ocean Palms, which she achieved by hitting the pavement and recruiting more volunteers to the program, developing lessons and a training program, and securing additional funding.

CAAP volunteers ultimately bring color, creativity and art to classrooms, but they needed inspiration to participate long term with this program. As a result, Parent created an environment where art had a wider definition with which everyone could relate and feel as though they had something to share with students. She continued to help volunteers on this journey with meaningful, formalized trainings, shared lesson plans, and through co-teaching when requested.

Today, it is commonplace at OPE to see volunteers with printed art pieces and art supplies walking through the halls, to take in pieces of art hanging on doors or bulletin boards throughout the school, or to hear students mention an artist by name. This is Parent's CAAP legacy living on at Ocean Palms, four years after she first began volunteering at the school, and it truly is a work of art.

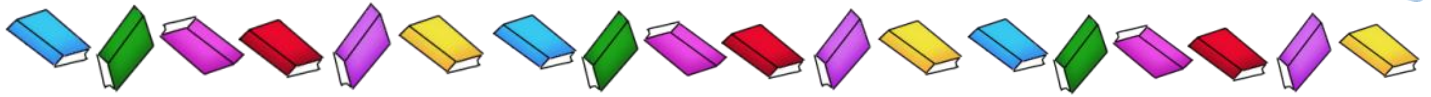

MIKE PARRISH MEMORIAL PATH



Please join us in remembering Mr. Mike Parrish, OPE principal from 1996 until his retirement in 2011.

BACKGROUND

Known for his unique connection with students - each of whom he knew by name - Mr. Parrish had an amazing impact on our community. Ocean Palms Elementary, through our PTO, is partnering with those whose lives were touched by Mr. Parrish to celebrate his life and share his legacy with today's Otters.



THE PROJECT: PARRISH STORYBOOK PATH

- 600-ft long paved surface on OPE's back field to be used for walking or running
- Storybook Stations featuring pages of rotating books to stop and read along the way
- Engraved bench and memorial sign/artwork honoring Mr. Parrish

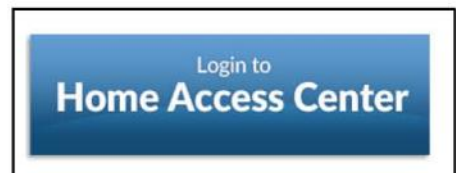

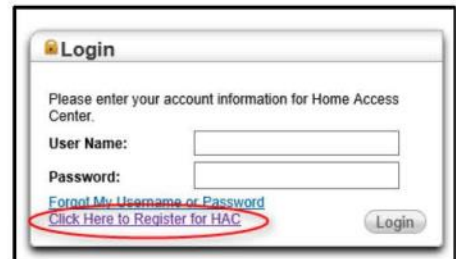

If you already have an account, you can log in using your user name and password. If you need to register for a HAC account, "Click here to register for HAC".

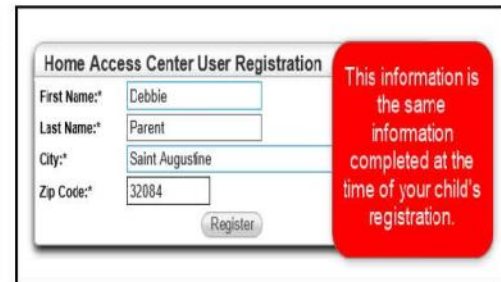



2. Bring your ID when you check in at the front office.

- Proper identification must be presented each time a person signs in at a school. The only forms of proper identification are the following:
 - Current state issued driver's license
 - Current state issued identification card (issued only by the DMV)
- If a person has a visa and/or does not have a social security number, the applicant must contact the Volunteer Services department right away for alternate steps.
- School access lasts for 3 year intervals. Upon approaching 3 years of access, it is the responsibility of the applicant to contact Volunteer Services and renew the form. To reduce duplication, do not complete a new form.



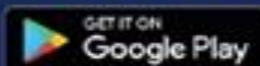
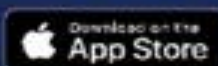
