It's simple, anonymous, and helps ensure safety by directly connecting you with local law enforcement and school officials. The app can be downloaded on both Apple and Android devices, so please consider adding this resource to your family's safety plan.

As we continue to navigate today's digital landscape, we also encourage families to talk about internet safety and the dangers of sharing personal information online. Ensuring your child knows what to look out for—whether it's online interactions or potential threats from strangers—helps empower them to make safe decisions. Open dialogue with your child can help them feel more secure and informed.

Additionally, if you or any family members plan to volunteer or attend any school events this year, please remember to complete the School Access Form at https://stjohns.keepntrack.com/apply. The approval process can take up to two weeks, so it's best to submit your application as soon as possible.








"Building Strong Readers: A Parent's Guide to Supporting Reading Progression"

Reading to and with your child is crucial for their overall development, and the benefits don't stop as they grow older. No matter their age, shared reading experiences continue to build language, literacy, and cognitive skills while fostering a love for learning. By reading aloud, you expose your child to rich vocabulary, sentence structures, and concepts that strengthen their ability to think critically and understand the world. Even older children benefit from this time, as it encourages discussion, deepens comprehension, and promotes emotional connection.

To make it even more engaging, consider hosting a family book club with multiple copies of the same book. This creates a shared experience that your child will love, and it gives you both a chance to dive deeper into stories together. Remember, if you're excited about reading, your child will be too! The enthusiasm you bring will make them eager to spend time with you and explore the worlds within books.

As you nurture your child's love for reading, it's important to understand the natural progression of reading skills they will develop over time. Just as children learn to speak one word at a time, learning to read follows a series of essential stages that build on one another. From recognizing print and sounds to mastering fluency and comprehension, each step is crucial to becoming a confident, independent reader. By knowing what to expect at each stage, you can better support your child's growth and celebrate their reading achievements. The following guide on pages 11 and 12 outlines the key components of reading development, providing insight into how you can help your child along this exciting journey.



"Building Strong Readers: A Parent's Guide to Supporting Reading Progression"

1. Print Awareness

Definition: Understanding the basic concepts of print (how books and written text work).

• How Parents Can Help:

- Read books with your child daily, pointing to the words as you read.
- Show them how to hold a book and turn the pages.
- Encourage your child to notice and point out words in their environment, like on signs or labels.

2. Oral Language Development

Definition: Building vocabulary and speaking skills as a precursor to reading.

How Parents Can Help:

- Engage in daily conversations with your child and ask open-ended questions.
- Encourage them to describe their day or tell a story.
- Read aloud to your child regularly, and discuss the story afterward to enhance language skills.

3. Phonemic Awareness

Definition: Recognizing and manipulating individual sounds (phonemes) in spoken words.

How Parents Can Help:

- Play word games like rhyming or "I Spy" with sounds (e.g., "I spy something that starts with /s/").
- Clap out syllables of words with your child (e.g., "ba-na-na").
- Practice segmenting sounds by saying a word and asking your child to break it into individual sounds.

4. Phonics (Decoding)

Definition: Understanding the relationship between sounds and letters, and using this to decode written words.

• How Parents Can Help:

- Practice letter-sound correspondences with your child using flashcards.
- Help your child sound out simple words while reading.
- Use magnetic letters or apps to practice building words and recognizing patterns.

5. Decoding and Encoding (Reading and Spelling)

Definition: Using phonics to read (decode) and spell (encode) words.

How Parents Can Help:

- Encourage your child to write simple words and sentences.
- Practice spelling common words together, focusing on sound patterns.
- Create a word wall at home with sight words your child is learning.

6. Fluency

Definition: Reading with accuracy, speed, and expression.

How Parents Can Help:

- Reread favorite books with your child to build confidence and fluency.
- Model fluent reading by reading aloud to your child with expression.
- Encourage your child to practice reading aloud daily.

7. Vocabulary Development

Definition: Learning and understanding the meaning of words to improve reading comprehension.

How Parents Can Help:

- Introduce new words during daily conversations and explain their meaning.
- When reading, pause to explain unfamiliar words and encourage your child to guess their meaning.
- Play vocabulary games like "Word of the Day" or "Guess the Word" using context.

8. Comprehension

Definition: Understanding and interpreting what is read.

• How Parents Can Help:

- Ask your child questions before, during, and after reading to check for understanding.
- Encourage them to summarize what they've read and make predictions about what will happen next.
- Connect the story to your child's own experiences to enhance understanding.

9. Motivation and Engagement

- Let your child choose books that interest them, whether it's fiction, non-fiction, or comics.
- Set aside dedicated reading time every day to build a routine.
- Celebrate your child's reading accomplishments, whether it's finishing a book or learning new words.

Keep an eye out for these enthusiastic learners as they continue their reading journey with excitement and confidence!
















How Do I Get Approved to Access the School Building?

In an ongoing endeavor to provide safety and security for students and staff, school access is required for every individual that is not a staff member of the St. Johns County School District. Below are the steps every visitor must complete to access the building during school hours.

1. Complete the School Access Form at https://stjohns.keepntrack.com/apply. Do not wait to complete your application because the process can potentially take up to two weeks to clear.



- 2. Bring your ID when you check in at the front office.
- Proper identification must be presented each time a person signs in at a school. The only forms of proper identification are the following:
 - Current state issued driver's license
 - Current state issued identification card (issued only by the DMV)
- If a person has a visa and/or does not have a social security number, the applicant must contact the Volunteer Services department right away for alternate steps.
- School access lasts for 3 year intervals. Upon approaching 3 years of access, it is the
 responsibility of the applicant to contact Volunteer Services and renew the form. To
 reduce duplication, do not complete a new form.

To register for a Home Access Center Account, "HAC", please follow the below instructions. Please note, only the **Parent or Legal Guardian** of the student can register for a HAC account and the student must be in compliance with Immunizations and Registration requirements as per District Policy. Only one account is needed per family.

Navigate to the St. Johns County School District website at http://www.stjohns.k12.fl.us/. Across the top of the homepage, you will see the HAC Icon. Click to enter HAC.
